
#### JAY LYNN GOMEZ Biography

Jay Lynn Gomez was born in 1986 in San Bernardino, California to undocumented Mexican immigrant parents who have since become US citizens. She briefly attended the California Institute for the Arts before leaving to take work as a live-in nanny with a West Hollywood family, an experience that did much to inform her subsequent artistic practice. Gomez's work is known for addressing issues of immigration and making visible the "invisible" labor forces that keep the pools, homes, and gardens of Los Angeles in such pristine condition.

In 2013 Gomez had her first solo exhibition at the UCLA Chicano Studies Research Center, and was also awarded with a residency to install a mural in West Hollywood Park, a project titled "The Caretakers", which remains on view. In 2014 Gomez had her solo gallery debut at Charlie James Gallery in Los Angeles, and went on to show widely across North America. In 2015 Gomez exhibited at the University of Michigan Institute for the Humanities, the Chicago Humanities Festival, and again at Charlie James Gallery. In the spring of 2016. Gomez had her third show "On Melrose" at the Charlie James Gallery in conjunction with the publication of a monograph on her work by Lawrence Weschler (Abrams), titled "Domestic Scenes: The Art of Ramiro Gomez". Gomez participated in the 2017 Whitney Biennial as part of Rafa Esparza's "Figure Ground: Beyond the White Field" installation. Her work was also included in three of the Getty's Pacific Standard Time: LA/LA exhibitions - "Home-So Different, So Appealing" at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA) and the MFA Houston, a joint show, "In West Hollywood" at the West Hollywood Library with her partner, David Feldman, and the Chapman University exhibition "My Barrio: Emigdio Vasquez and Chicana/o Identity in Orange County." In 2017 Gomez was featured in "The Sweat Of Their Faces" at the National Portrait Gallery in Washington DC. In 2018 Gomez had her first NY solo show at PPOW Gallery titled "In NYC." In 2019 Gomez had a two-person show at the Barrick Museum at UNLV titled "Sorry for the Mess." In 2019 Gomez had her fourth solo show with Charlie James Gallery titled "Here, For A Moment." In 2020 Gomez had a solo presentation with PPOW Gallery at the ADAA Fair in New York City and is featured in "Alien Vs. Citizen" at the Museum of Contemporary Art Chicago.

Gomez has exhibited at the MCA Chicago, the Smithsonian National Portrait Gallery, LACMA, Denver Art Museum, MFA Houston, Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art, Torrance Art Museum, Cornell Fine Arts Museum, MCA San Diego and Museum of Latin American Art (MoLAA) among others. Gomez's work has been covered in the Atlantic, the New Yorker, New York Times Magazine, the Washington Post, NPR, the Los Angeles Times, Artforum, Hyperallergic, Huffington Post, and CNN among others. 

#### Words from Jay Lynn Gomez:


"My cardboard work comes from a deep place within me. Experiencing the loss of my grandmother will forever be the formative moment. There's something about the ephemerality of the discarded material that I gravitate towards and find it therapeutic to transform it into art.

When I was asked by Charlie James Gallery to create work for the Frieze Art Fair, I knew I wanted to collaborate with Patrick Martinez again. We talked about our loved ones and their lasting influence on us. and I immediately connected with him sharing about his Mother. Patrick's Mom. Evelyn Martinez. cleaned the Federal building in downtown Los Angeles for many years. She cleaned it with pride, when she was sick and when her body was failing her. I felt honored that Patrick shared with me beautiful, personal photos which inspired me to create a portrait representing a memory of her. He explained to me how he often paints in the same movements she did while cleaning, so I knew where I wanted to place my figure."







### JAY LYNN GOMEZ West Hollywood Mural, Sept 2013



The City of West Hollywood through its Arts and Cultural Affairs Commission presents The Caretakers (Los Cuidadores), a new art installation of painted workers installed as a series of figurative murals in West Hollywood Park by Ramiro Gomez, a local artist who lives and works in West Hollywood.

Ramiro Gomez is known for making visible the "invisible" workforce of westside communities by installing life-size cardboard cutouts of nannies, gardeners, valet workers and housekeepers in and around West Hollywood, Beverly Hills and other westside locations.

Ramiro Gomez sees the City of West Hollywood as a diverse blend of people from many different ethnic and social backgrounds, connecting specifically with the many people who work in various domestic and service-oriented jobs in the city. "I am constantly walking around or finding inspiration in the various, brief situations I come across, such as the nanny pushing a stroller, a housekeeper waiting for the bus, a gardener trimming a hedge, or a valet waiting in front of restaurants and stores around Melrose Place," he says, when asked about his inspiration. "These seeming unremarkable scenes of people who work here are in actuality significant representations of the labor that enables this city to operate. There is glamour and luxury in West Hollywood," he says, "but there are people who are needed to maintain that luxury." It is at the intersection of glamour, luxury, and labor that Gomez sees beauty.
