"You belong to the volcano god now," she insisted.



Over a long career as an art critic, Robinson served as founding editor of Art-Rite (1973-1977), art editor of the East Village Eye (1983-1985), and founding editor of Artnet Magazine (1996-2012).












Indochina Acrylic on canvas 72 x 48 inches 2021



The Pit Acrylic on canvas 60 x 60 inches 2022




Yellow River Acrylic on canvas 60 x 60 inches 2022


